*This is a second foray into the author's life experiences as she re-introduces readers to her extended family and friends who were first encountered in her previous book **Tales from the Seaside**. This selection of tales are taken from other family holidays which span the author's lifetime. Readers accompany the family as they gallop across Europe, go north of the border and attempt to exchange their water-skis for snow skis, deal with mother*

and daughter drunken escapades, excitable vibrating beds, being marooned in a dinghy after losing the oars and the author's first (and only) bull-fighting experience. More fun and frolics experienced by all.

Some Nautical Tales covers the adventures and experiences of Captain Wilbur H. Vantine, as he worked his way up from Ordinary Seaman and sailed as Ship Master on transoceanic freighters in the United States Merchant Marine. Along the way he was able to "see the world" at a very interesting time in world affairs. During WWII, he served on two ships in the war zones of the southwest Pacific and on another in the North Atlantic to the United Kingdom. He obtained his first command in 1951 at age twenty-six. While sailing as Ship Master, he did difficult navigation among icebergs in the far north; had his ship breaking up and losing three of its four lifeboats in a "super" storm, was confined with his crew on a Liberty ship, in ballast, during a winter-time crossing of the North Atlantic, with a killer virus on board, sailed to Korea before, during and after the Korean War, took action to minimize damage from an un-avoidable collision and directed actions to separate the two ships which were connected by their anchor chains, made an ocean crossing with growing cracks in the main deck threatening to cause his ship to break-up, steamed transpacific with a cargo of coal undergoing spontaneous combustion, had his ship boarded and crew attacked by a large and angry mob in Yugoslavia, had a shifting cargo of army tanks threatening to knock out the sides of his ship during a storm, and had unique interaction with both ship and shore personalities. This book was authored during Captain Vantine's 79th and 80th years, referring to notes and records that were made at the time of the events. It is all based on actual

Combine a neighborhood in turmoil, a strong blue-collar family, and a teenager with middle class instincts - what do you get? Row House Blues, the controversial sequel to Row House Days.

Jack Myers' fictionalized memoir explores the dynamics of being raised in a declining Southwest Philadelphia neighborhood.

When There Is No Wind, Row tells the story about the remarkable career path the author traveled to become a lawyer. When she began that journey in the 1960s, social and cultural barriers were high - women were supposed to become wives and mothers not lawyers - forcing her to tack to different careers. She faced financial barriers as well. The author tells about growing up poor in the 1950s in Kennebunk, Maine. When she left for college, scholarship awards and a student loan with savings from her summer jobs didn't cover her first-year college costs. But she made it, graduating Phi Beta Kappa in 1966, even though married and supporting her widowed mother by her junior year. Her plans for law school were thwarted by the lack of financial aid for women for professional schools. When she began her job search in Boston, want ads were segregated by gender. She landed interviews for "male" jobs

through an employment agent who failed to disclose she was female. The first interviewer refused to see her and, at her next interview, she was made to wait for seven hours. She finally landed a job as computer programmer at an insurance company even though she didn't know what a computer was. Her qualification for the job - she could play bridge! At age 30, the author left her computer career for law school - student aid for women had become available with passage of Title IX of the Civil Rights Act. The barriers for entry into the legal profession in Boston for a lawyer with her unusual "credentials" - female, mid-30s, married, a mother, a public school education and a prior career - were too high to overcome. She tacked to a unique job with the consulting firm, Arthur D. Little, Inc. supporting the company's international projects at the outset of economic globalization. At age 40, she finally began practicing law, building up an international tax practice well before fax, email and the Internet. At age 50, she parlayed her career experiences to found a successful tax software company with her husband.
