E questo sia per la durata e diffusione dei suoi scritti (che dopo le trilogie cinematografiche di Peter Jackson hanno ormai un riscontro planetario), ma anche e soprattutto per i suoi meriti letterari. Tuttavia questo fatto non sembra essere ancora recepito negli ambienti universitari (specie italiani) e nelle storie della letteratura in genere. È da questa consapevolezza che l'Associazione Italiana di Studi Tolkieniani ha promosso il progetto «Tolkien e i Classici». Si tratta di un work in progress iniziato con un call for papers (rivolto anche a studiosi esteri) con la finalità di raccogliere studi non specialistici che confrontassero Tolkien con altri classici, non solo della letteratura ma della cultura in genere. I vari saggi ricevuti, dopo un attento lavoro redazionale, sono qui raccolti in tre sezioni: - Tolkien e i classici antichi; - Tolkien e i classici medievali; - Tolkien e i classici moderni. Scorrendo l'indice di «Tolkien e i Classici» si potrà notare che il volume comprende autori che Tolkien ha citato nelle sue lettere o nelle sue conferenze (è il caso di Kenneth Grahame), autori che siamo certi conoscesse per i suoi studi, che li abbia nominati direttamente o no (Omero, Virgilio, Chaucer), e autori che quasi certamente non ha conosciuto (Giovannino Guareschi). Ciò che si prefigge questa pubblicazione è offrire al lettore appassionato, ma anche alle scuole e alle Università italiane (nelle quali molto lentamente Tolkien sta iniziando ad entrare) un valido strumento di orientamento critico che possa adeguatamente collocare l'autore del «Signore degli Anelli» a fianco degli altri classici della cultura, come giustamente merita la sua inimitabile opera.
